


Create your own lesson plans in Schoolnet to schedule in your Lesson Planner or to keep handy in your My Materials section.

- 1. From the Classrooms menu, click Instructional Materials
- In the subject pull down tab, select 21st Century Classroom Resources. Click Search.



3. Locate the **21st Century Classroom Lesson Plan Template** and click **Save**. This template will now always be found in your personal set of materials.

6. In the **Properties** tab on the lesson template, enter the following information (* required fields).

*Title	Enter a descriptive title for the lesson that will make it easy to locate later.
*Subject	Select a subject from the drop-down menu. The Subject (and Grade Level) fields determine the default standards that are available to align to.
*Grade Range	Select the grade range.
*Description	Include a synopsis of what the lesson is meant to accomplish. This field will appear in search results in Classrooms.
Duration	Only whole numbers may be entered in this field. Also select the appropriate unit of time: minute, hour, day or week. This is a text field only – the duration is for informational purposes and will not impact scheduling.



- 10. Click **1-Lesson Plan Description** and scroll down and edit each field to add corresponding content. The other numbered fields are not needed when using this template.






Submit a Lesson Plan for Approval

1. Locate the lesson created within My Materials.



2. Click on the name of the lesson. Click the **Submit to School Bank** on the right side of the page.



3. A message appears, giving more information about the approval process and asking you to verify that you want to submit the material; click **OK**

Notice that the link to submit is no longer visible. The item status is now **Pending**.

Upon review, you'll receive an email saying that either the item is approved and in the materials bank, or it is not approved and the status is back to Private.
