

Schoolnet: Creating Custom Reports


Audience Roles: Leadership, Staff with Specialist and/or Analyst
 Most districts publish a number of reports in the School & District Data Report Banks and the Benchmark Dashboard. However, you may have some data questions that these reports cannot answer, questions that require custom parameters. Once you understand the principles behind the examples below, you will be able to create a variety of reports.

Creating a Standardized Test Report


In this example, look at subject level standardized test results by grade level for the current students at a school.

To run the report:

1. Roll your cursor over **School & District Data** and click **Custom Reports**
2. Click **Define Student Set**
3. Create filters to narrow the student set to only the students who are currently enrolled in your school by choosing **Enrollment** for **Create Filter 1** then click the radio button next to **Total Enrollment** under section 2 for **School Enrollment**; use the default values for all other fields



4. Click **Apply Filter**
5. Click **Go** to create a report for your student set




6. If not already selected, choose **Standardized Test**
7. Select the **School Year** the students took the test

Do not specify the school if you want results for students regardless of where they took the test.



8. Select the **Test Type**


Do not filter any other fields.





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- Click **Go to Viewing Options**
- Use the default view option, **Table**
- Select only the following options: **Test Score Group** for **Columns**, **None** for **Sub-Columns**, **Subject/Section** for **Rows**, **None** for **Sub-Rows**; then check to divide the report and choose **Grade Level** from the **Paging** menu

Paging

Divide this report into multiple pages, one for each:

Grade Level

- Click **Run Report**

The report displays the number of students in each score group, organized by subject

- Select a different option from the **Grade Level** menu (this is the option you selected for the field under Paging)
- In order to add row and column totals, click **edit** next to **Viewing Options**

Viewing Options: Table (edit)

- Under **View Data in Cells As** change **Value** to **Percentage of Row** and change the **Row and Column Totals** to **Both Totals**

- Click **Run Report** to view how the altered selections have changed the report


Note that you may have to reselect the **Grade Level**.

- To save this report, click **Save Report** and follow the onscreen instructions

Running a Report at the Test Subsection Level


For a variation on the above report, modify it as described below:

1. For the **Report Type & Data** option of the generated report, click **edit**


2. Select **Reading** from the **Test Section** menu and change the **Test Subsection** menu to **Any Sub-Section** or **Either Sub-Section**
